## What do I need to do to get started?

Go to the **mandatory Orientation**

## Is Community Service 100 like a regular class with homework?

Instead of lectures... serve at a community partner site. Instead of homework... attend orientation and a reflection session, submit a placement confirmation, service log, site evaluation and self-evaluation and write an essay about your service experience. You receive a grade for the course- **S**/satisfactory or **NC**/no credit. If for some reason you do not plan on completing the course, you will need to drop the course to avoid receiving a grade of NC. Drop dates for Fall 2019: **September 20<sup>th</sup>**-last day to drop a course without a grade of W and **November 1<sup>st</sup>**- last day to drop a course with a grade of W.

## Who are the Coordinators you mentioned?

Coordinators are students trained to be one of your primary CMSV 100 resources.

Coordinators facilitate orientation and reflection sessions and assist you with the CMSV 100 process.

## What do I do if I have a conflict on August 28<sup>th</sup> and can't attend my scheduled Orientation?

Only class conflicts or having a scheduled athletic event (not including practice) should be reasons for missing orientation. If you need to come to a make-up session or if you have questions, contact your Community Service coordinator prior to Orientation.
